




WILLIAM PENN, Proprietary & Govern<sup>r</sup> of ye Province of

 where not already taken up according to ye method of Townships  
 appointed by me, they seating ye same according to Regulation  
 & make returns there of into my Secretary's Office. Given at  
 Philadelphia ye 16<sup>th</sup> of ye 3<sup>d</sup> mo 1684.
