

That We would Grant him to take up & inclose one square of Ground between Mulberry & Sassafras Streets and between the ~~Ninth & Tenth~~ Streets from Delaware and that he may hold the same for the Space of one & Twenty Years next ensuing after the date hereof for which He agrees to pay to the use of ye Prop' or Trustees of the Province Forty Shillings Sterling Mony of Great Britain Yearly during the Said Term and at the Expiration thereof to deliver up and Surrender the Same under a good Fence & well improved. These are to Authorize and require thee to Survey & layout unto the said William Gray in the place afore said the said Square of Ground To be by him held under the said Yearly ~~Rent~~ Rent of Forty Shillings Sterling which in case the said William Gray Yearly fulfill & pay Then this Survey for the said Term shall be Valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted.
