These are to require thee forthwith to resurvey to the said Edward ~~Witham~~ the sd Tract of three hundred Acres of Land Scituate as aforesaid and make Returns thereof into the General Surveyors Office <sup>at Philadelphia.</sup> where this Warrant is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delivered to thee certified by the Secretary who is also to take a Duplicate of thy Return into his Office. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 16<sup>th</sup> day of the 12<sup>th</sup> Month 1701.
