At the Request of Daniel Falkner, Johannes Kelpius and  
Johannes Jawert Agents for the German Society. That I would  
grant them to take up one hundred and Twenty Acres of Land in  
the Liberties of Philadelphia in part of two hundred Acres for-  
merly granted them by a Warr.<sup>t</sup> from my Self bearing date ye 16<sup>th</sup>  
day of the 5<sup>th</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1684 in right of part of their Original Purchase,  
but <sup>was</sup> not laid out: These are to require thee forthwith to Survey or  
cause to be Survey'd unto them the said Number of one hundred  
and twenty Acres on that Tract of Land in ye said Liberties on  
which John Ball is now seated, if it contain so much, and if not,  
then to lay out the Remainder or Complem.<sup>t</sup> making up ye sd 120  
Acres in some other vacant place of the sd Liberties, and make  
Returns there of into my Secretaries Office. Given under my  
Hand & Seal at Philadelphia the 27<sup>th</sup> of ye 10<sup>th</sup> Month 1700.
