At the Request of Joseph Groudon in behalf of the Heirs of George Fox That I would grant him to take up for Dan^t Abraham four hundred and eight Acres and one third of an Acre of Land in this Province being one third of the sd George Fox's Original purchase of 1250 Acres bequeathed by the sd George in his last Will and Testament to the sd Daniel Abraham and his Children. These are to require thee forthwth to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the sd Dan^t Abraham and his Children the sd Number of four hundred and eight Acres and one third of an Acre of Land in this Province not already taken up nor conced'd nor seated by the Indians, and make Returns there of into my Secretaries Office. Given under my hand and Seal at Philade- lphia the 10th day of 8^{ber} 1701.
