At ye Request of Andrew Griscom. y<sup>t</sup> I would grant him to take up  
his Proportion of Land w<sup>th</sup> in ye Liberties of ye City answerable to his <sup>acre</sup> 500  
Purchase. These are to will and require thee forthw<sup>th</sup> to survey or  
cause to be survey'd unto him w<sup>th</sup> in ye Bounds Ten Acres of Land  
where not taken up & if practicable according to ye Method of  
Townships appointed by me & make return thereof into my  
Secretary's Office. Given at Philadelphia ye 12<sup>th</sup> of ye 4<sup>th</sup> M<sup>o</sup> 1763
