These are to will & require thee in ye Proprietarys Name forth w.<sup>th</sup> to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him ye Land w.<sup>th</sup> in ye Liberties & Lott in ye City, he fencing it in & building upon ye Same w.<sup>th</sup> in six Months from ye Date of Survey & make returns there of into ~~ye~~ ye Secretary's Office. Given at Philadelphia ye 24<sup>th</sup> 7<sup>br</sup> 1684.
