

Whereas there happened some difference between John Green & Hugh Marsh about a Lott of Land formerly said to be Thomas Livesey's beyond the swamps here on Delaware, & in the ~~third~~^{fourth} Street and the Govern'r having had the hearing of it (obl.) me to take a f (obl.) pt. of the Lott & to leave the other three pts to John Green, and so to put an end to the difference. I do hereby according adjudge, that John Green shall be abated the 4th pt. of what Hugh Marsh paid Thomas Livesey for the bare lott, which is one pound tenn shillings seven pence halfpenny and so John Green to have & enjoy the other three pts of the said Lott & the house thereon, & to pay (obl.) said Hugh Marsh according to the bargain abating onely as aforesaid.
