

Pursuant to a Warrant under the hand and seal of the Proprietary and Governour to me directed bearing date the 27th day of the 12th month 1709. ~

I do hereby certify that I have caused to be Resurveyed unto Josiah Ellis Son of Josiah Ellis first purchaser a certain Tract of Land scituate on the West side of Potquessin Creek in the County of Philadelphia formerly laid out unto Samuel Ellis Brother to the said Josiah Ellis the Elder for five hundred acres, Beginning at a post sett in the ground near a white oak standing in the Line of William Hibbs's Land, from thence South East by an old Line of marked trees eight hundred and sixty perches to another post sett in the ground by the said Potquessin Creek from thence by the several courses of the same one hundred forty and four perches to a marked tree standing by the said Creek side from thence North West by an old Line of marked trees seven hundred eighty and four perches to another post sett in the ground by a Road running by the said Hibbs's Line, from thence North East by an old Line of marked trees one hundred and nine perches to the first mentioned Corner post, containing five hundred and seventy acres. Resurveyed the 27th day of 1st month 1701, and Returned according to the above said Resurvey and Bounds into the Proprietary and Governours Secretary's Office the 30th day of the 2^d month 1701.
