That We would Grant her to take up fifteen hundred Acres of Land part of Five Thousand Acres the Purchase of Thomas Hudson whose Attorney William Biles in his life time granted & Convey'd the same to J<sup>no</sup> Talman and others of Flushing on Long Island) who by his Deed Poll dated the 11<sup>th</sup> of June last past Convey'd the said fifteen Hundred Acres to the said Thomas Stevenson These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said Sarah Stevenson in the said Province the said Quantity of fifteen hundred Acres of Land According to the Method of Townships and that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office Given under our Hands and the Seal of ye Province at Philadelphia the 10<sup>th</sup> day of December Anno Domini 1719
