

Rich. Hilliard's Land.

By Vertue of a Warrt from Edward Penington Survey<sup>r</sup>  
Generall bearing date the 17<sup>th</sup> of 10<sup>m</sup> 1700. directed unto  
me I hereby Certify into his Offic that I have Rec<sup>d</sup> Surveyd and  
Laid out unto George Smedly a Certain Tract of Land in the  
County of Philadelphia begining at a Corner Stak<sub>sett</sub> in  
the ground being a Corner deviding it from the Land Tho:  
Madoks bought of Thomas ffairman from thenc<sub>o</sub> by a Line  
of Marked trees North East five hundred & tenn p<sub>r</sub>ches  
to a stak<sub>sett</sub> in the ground in the Line of Joseph Fishers  
Land from thenc<sub>o</sub> by the said ffishers Line of marked trees  
South East Sixty & seven p<sub>r</sub>ches to a stak<sub>sett</sub> in the ground  
deviding it from the Land of Richard Hilliard from thenc<sub>o</sub> by the  
said Hilliard Line of marked trees South West five hundred and  
ten p<sub>r</sub>ches to another stak<sub>sett</sub> in the ground from thenc<sub>o</sub>  
by a Line of marked trees: North West: Sixty & Seven p<sub>r</sub>ches  
to ye plac<sub>o</sub> of begining Containing and Laid out fore 213 acres & 90 p<sub>r</sub>.  
Surveyd ye 20<sup>th</sup> 10<sup>th</sup> m<sup>o</sup>
