Rich. Hilliard's Land.

By Vertue of a Warr^t from Edward Penington Survey^r Generall bearing date the 17th of 10^{mo} 1700. directed unto me I hereby Certify into his Offic^e that I have Rec^d Surveyd and Laid out unto George Smedly a Certain Tract of Land in the County of Philadelphia begining at a Corner Stak^e sett in the ground being a Corner deviding it from the Land Tho: Madoks bought of Thomas Fairman from thenc^e by a Line of Marked trees North East five hundred & ten p^rches to a stak^e sett in the ground in the Line of Joseph Fishers Land from thenc^e by the said Fishers Line of marked trees South East Sixty & seven p^rches to a stak^e sett in the ground deviding it from the Land of Richard Hilliard from thenc^e by the said Hilliard Line of marked trees South West five hundred and ten p^rches to another stak^e sett in the ground from thenc^e by a Line of marked trees: North West: Sixty & Seven p^rches to ye plac^e of begining Containeing and Laid out fore 213 acres & 90 p^rches. Surveyd ye 20th 10^{mo} 1700.
