

Pennsylvania S.S.

Whereas Upon a Regulation made of the Lands formerly laid out to Richd Sneed of the City of Bristol Original Purchaser of fifteen hundred Acres there have been Granted to him the quantity of Eight hundred & fifty eight Acres of Land laid out in two Tracts w<sup>ch</sup> with twenty four Acres belonging to the s<sup>d</sup> purchase in the Liberties of the City Philad<sup>ia</sup> makes in ye whole eight hundred & eighty two Acres So that there <sup>now</sup> remains Six hundred and eighteen Acres of the s<sup>d</sup> Purchase to be yet taken up.

And Whereas at the time of the s<sup>d</sup> Regulation it was agreed upon by us that the s<sup>d</sup> Richd Should have ten Acres allowed to him for every hundred of his Purchase upon his disappointm<sup>t</sup> in losing part of ye Land formerly laid out to him (tho. wrongfully) by the Surveyors on part of the Welch Tract in the County of Chester which s<sup>d</sup> Allowance gives him One hundred & fifty Acres more all w<sup>ch</sup> ye S<sup>d</sup> Richard's Agents request may be now taken up. These therefore are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd to the s<sup>d</sup> Richard Sneed according to the Method of Townships appointed the full quantity of Seven hundred and Sixty eight Acres of Land in this Province that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands & Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 29<sup>th</sup> day of Novemb<sup>r</sup> in ye year of our L<sup>d</sup> 1708.
