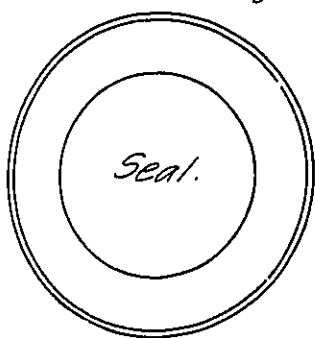


*Pensylvania ꝑ.**By the Commissioners of Property*

*At the Request of Elenor Cook Widow That we would grant her one hundred Acres of Vacant Land in y<sup>e</sup> County of Chester adjoining to that laid out to Jn<sup>o</sup> Maxwell for which she has agreed to pay ten pounds to the Proprietors. use in one year with Nine Months Interest for the same: These are to authorize thee to survey or cause to be Survey'd to the said Elen<sup>r</sup> Cook the said quantity of One hundred Acres of Vacant Land in the place afores<sup>d</sup> and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Which survey in case the said Elenor fulfill the agreem<sup>t</sup> afores<sup>d</sup> shall be valid Otherwise the same shall be void as if it had never been made nor this Warr<sup>t</sup> ever granted. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad<sup>ia</sup> y<sup>e</sup> 18<sup>th</sup> day of Novemb<sup>r</sup>. A.D. 1713*
