


Pennsylvania

Whereas James Chevers of the County of Chester hath made it appear to us that he came into this Province with the first Adventurers a Servant to Edward Bezer and hath thereupon Requested us that we would grant him to take up his Right in Head Land in this Province pursuant to the Proprietaries Concessions in that case made and granted. These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the sd James Chevers fifty acres of land in this Province where not already <sup>Survey'd nor</sup> taken up nor is concealed nor seated by the Indians And make Returns thereof into the Secretary's Office. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad <sup>in</sup> the 29<sup>th</sup> day of 9<sup>th</sup> 1709
