


Pensilvania J.S.



By the Commissioners of Property

At the Request of Gabriel Davis of Radnor in this Province that we would grant him to take up among the branches of Conestogo-the quantity of four hundred & fifty acres of land for which he agrees to pay to the use of the Trustees five and fforty pounds mony of Pensilvania for the whole and ye yearly quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for each Hundred Acres & in proportion thereto for the fifty acres. These are to authorize and require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Gabriel Davis on the said branches according to the Method of Townships the said quantity of four Hundred & fifty acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said Gabriel fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadelphia ye 1<sup>st</sup> day of November Anno Domini 1718.
