These are to will & require three forthwith to survey or cause to be survey'd unto him y^e said number of Acres in y^e aforementioned place where not already taken up according to y^e method of Townships appointed by me & make returns thereof into my Secretary's Office. Given at Philadelphia y^e 27th 10 br. 1683
