

Resurveyd the 31<sup>st</sup> of May 1718 by virtue of a warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the 30<sup>th</sup> of the same month and year unto Thomas Symons late <sup>County of</sup> of the County of Pembroke a Tract of Land in the Welch Tract in the Chester laid out for two hundred acres (in Right or in Part of five hundred acres the Original Purchase of his Grandfather Thomas Symmons) Beginning at a Spanish Oak in a line of the Mannor of Mountjoy and at a Corner of Morris David's Land thence by the said Mannor and the Land of Isaac Norris South South East one hundred and Eleven Pches to a Black Oak Sapling then West South West three hundred and twenty perches to a black oak sapling then by the land of Lewis Walker North North West One hundred and Eleven Perches to a Black Oak then by the said Morris Davids Land East North East three hundred & twenty Pches. to the place of Beginning Containing two hundred twenty two acres.

Return'd into the Secretaries Office the 2<sup>d</sup> of June Anno. 1718.
