


Pensilvania s.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Thomas Eldridge of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up within the said County five hundred Acres of land for which he agrees to pay to the Propriet^{rs} use fifty ^{Pounds} Mony of Pensilvania for the whole and the Yearly Quittrent of one Shilling Sterling for every hundred acres. These are to Authorize and require thee to Survey or cause ^{to be Survey'd} a unto the said Thomas Eldridge in the said County according to the Method of Townships appointed the said quantity of five hundred Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is seated by the Indians and make a Return thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said Thomas Eldridge fulfill the above agreement w^tin three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted Given under our hands and Seal of the Province at Philadelphia the 12th day of y^e 10^{mo} A.D. 1716
