


Pennsylvania



William Penn Absolute Proprietary and Govern<sup>r</sup> in Chief of the  
Province of Pennsylvania and Counties Annexed.

At the Request of Sam<sup>l</sup> Robinet Son and Richard Bond Son in Law of  
Allen Robinet that I would grant them a Resurvey on a Tract of Land in Chester  
County in y<sup>e</sup> Township of Upper Providence laid out to y<sup>e</sup> 5<sup>d</sup> Allen for 250 Acres  
first purchaser of the same. These are to require thee forthwith to Resurvey or  
cause to be resurvey'd the said Tract according to its first true bounds and Lines  
of Survey and to cutt off from y<sup>e</sup> same fifty acres to Randal Mealin of w<sup>ch</sup>  
he is now possessed and one hundred acres thereof to Joseph Baker now in his  
Occupation and of w<sup>ch</sup> make exact Returns into my Secretaries Office. Given  
under my hand and Seal at Philad<sup>ia</sup> the 4<sup>th</sup> day of y<sup>e</sup> 1<sup>st</sup> Mo<sup>th</sup> 1709
