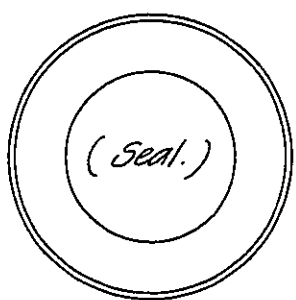


Pensylvania fo.*By the Commissioners of Property.**Edwards*

At the Request of Thomas A of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up among the late Surveys made back in the said County the quantity of five hundred acres of Land for which he agrees to pay to the use of the Trustees of the Province fifty Pounds money thereof for the whole and the yearly Quitrent of One Shilling Sterling for each hundred acres. These are to authorize and require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the said Thomas Edwards among the said late Surveys according to the method of Townships appointed the said quantity of five hundred acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make returns thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said Thomas—fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad^a the 18th day of y^e 9th month A. D. 1718
