



By ye Comission<sup>rs</sup> Impowerd to grant Lots & Lands in ye Province of Pennsylvania & ye Territories thereunto belonging.

At ye Request of Keels Laerson Frend yt wee would grant him a Resurvey of his Land in ye Township of Upland being one hundred fifty Acres according to ye Patent from ye Goverr<sup>t</sup> of New York 1669 & if in ye exact Survey any more Land should be found yt he might have it paying for ye same as others: These are in ye Proprietor's Name to will & require thee to resurvey or cause a resurvey to be made running one mile long into ye Woods & of equal breath in ye Woods as allowed in the front of ye aforesaid tract of Land & make a true Return thereof w<sup>t</sup> what is more into ye Secretary's Office, yt, as He desireth, a Patent may be prepared for it. Given at Philadelphia y<sup>e</sup> 4<sup>th</sup> of y<sup>e</sup> 12<sup>th</sup> M<sup>o</sup> 1684.
