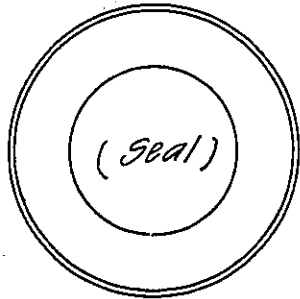

*At the Request of John Fincher of the County of Chester that we would grant him to take up a parcel of Vacant Land Situate between the land laid out to the London Company John Simcock & Peter Britain, in y<sup>e</sup> sd. County for which the said John Fincher agrees to pay to the Propriet<sup>rs</sup> use after the rate of thirteen Pounds & the yearly Quitrent of one Shilling Sterling for one Hundred Acres be the same less or more These are to authorize and Require thee to Survey or Cause to be Survey'd unto the said J<sup>r</sup> Fincher the said Parcel of Vacant Land provided the same be clear of all other Surveys and Lawfull claims and make a Return thereof into the Secretarys Office which Survey in case the said John Fincher fulfill the above agreement within three months after the date hereof shall be valid otherwise the same is to be void as if it had never been made nor this Warrant ever granted. Given under our hands & Seal of y<sup>e</sup> Province at Philadelphia the 23<sup>d</sup> of the 2<sup>d</sup> month Anno D<sup>ni</sup> 1716*
