Sam^l Blunston being employd to write a Deed from J. Linvell to George Gray who sells to Mich^l Shank describes it very differently from this Draught (Linvell sells to Gray & Gray to Shank all that part of Linvells tract that lies on the North side of the Road. S. Blunstons description in ye D^d is thus. Begin^g at a Hickery Tree &c. thence E. N. E. 108. then S. by E. 88 to the Road then by it S 87. W 107. thence N. by W 45 P^s to ye begin^g contain^g 43^a these Co^s dist. will not close; it is a very great mistake at least.
