That I would grant him a Re-survey on a certain Tract of Land in the Township of Abington in the County of Philadelphia cutt off to Joseph Knight (upon an Execution for Debt) for three hundred thirty and five Acres out of a Tract of 500 Acres laid out to Philip Lehman and is now in the possession of the Said James Sansom by Virtue of a deed of Sale thereof to him made by Thomas Potts, who purchased it of the said Knight: These are to require thee forthwith to resurvey or cause to be resurvey'd ~~the said~~ according to the first Lines of Survey. the Said 335 Acres, together with 165 Acres. be it more or less, the remainder completing the whole Said Tract of 500 Acres. and make Returns thereof in distinct parcels into my Secretaries Office. Given under my Hand and Seal at Philadelphia the 21st of ye first Month 170⁹.
