

Pursuant to a Warrant under the hand and seal of the Proprietary and Governor to me directed bearing date the 21st day of the first month 1701, requiring me according to the request of James Sansom to Resurvey a certain Tract in the Township of Abington in the County of Philadelphia cutt off to Joseph Knight (upon an execution for debt) for three hundred thirty and five acres out of a Tract laid out to Phillip Lehmane and is now in the possession of the said James Sansom by virtue of a Deed of sale thereof to him made by Thomas Potts, who purchased it of the said Knight. Together with one hundred thirty and five acres, be it more or less, the Remainder compleating the said whole Tract off five hundred acres. I do hereby certify that I have caused the said whole Tract to be Resurveyed and find it to be subdivided into three distinct parcels, beginning at a post dividing it from Silas Crispin's land from thence North East two hundred thirty and eight perches by an old Line of marked trees to another post, from thence continuing the same Course one hundred forty two perches and two nineteen parts of a perch to another post, from thence continuing the same Course one hundred twenty and six perches to another post, from thence South East by the Manner of Moreland one hundred fifty ^{two} perches to another post, from thence South West one hundred twenty and six perches unto another post, from whence a North West Line being run to its opposite post will make this parcel ll of the Tract to contain one hundred nineteen acres and one hundred and twelve perches, and then reasssuming the South West course and continuing the same one hundred and fourty two perches & two nineteen parts of a perch to another post standing there and from thence running again North West to its opposite post makes that parcel ll to contain one hundred thirty and five ^{same} acres, then again reasssuming the said South West course and continuing the (as also the precedent distances upon the same course run) by the Land of John Sibley two hundred thirty eight perches to another post, from thence North West two hundred fifty and two perches to the place of beginning makes this third parcel to contain two hundred twenty six acres and sixteen perches so that the whole Tract contains four hundred and eighty acres and one hundred twenty eight perches. Resurveyed the 28th day of the 1st month 1701, and Returned according to the above said Survey and bounds into the Proprietary and Governor's Secretary's Office the 25th day of the 4th month 1701.
