And make Returns in to the General Surveyors Office at Philad^{ia} where this Warr^t is to remain and a Copy thereof to be delv'd to thee certified by the Secretary. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philad^{ia} the 22^d of the 12th Month 1702.
