



John Linvil's Land at Conestogoe - in the County of Chester, being part of Eleven Hundred Acres of Land Survey'd unto James Hendrickson the 19th day of October 1716.

Begining at a post Standing in the Line of the Land of Melchior Prenamon being a Corner of Jeremy Langhorne's land. Thence North by West by ye Land of the sd Melchior Prenamon and ye Land of Hans Moyer 222 pches to a post. thence West South West by the land of Thomas Gale 163 pches to ~~post~~ ^{a hickery}. Thence South Sixteen degrees East by ye Land of Thomas Baldwin 222 pches to a post. Thence East North East by Land of ye said Jeremy Langhorne 147 pches to ye place of Beginning Containing 200 Acres and ~~the~~ the Allowance of Six p^r Cent.
