Seal. At the Request of James Spencer Son of John Spencer, <sup>deceased</sup> Original Purchaser of Two Hundred and Fifty Acres of Land in this Province. That we would Grant him to take up one hundred and twenty five Acres yet remaining untaken up (as is alledged) of the Purchase aforesaid. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd to the sd James in ye Right aforesaid the said quantity of one hundred and twenty five Acres of Land in this Province that has not been already Survey'd nor taken up nor is Concealed nor Seated by the Indians. to be laid out according to ye Method of Townships appointed, and make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands and Seal of the sd Province at Philadelphia the 29<sup>th</sup> day of Novemb<sup>r</sup> 1707.
