

Pursuant to a Warrant under the hand and seal of the Proprietary and Governour to me directed bearing date the 2^d day of the 7th month 1700. I do hereby certify that I have caused to be surveyed unto Christopher Pennock for the use of his Son Joseph Pennock in right of George Collett old Purchaser a certain Tract of Land scituate on the south side of Brandywine Creek in the County of Chester. Beginning at a post sett in the ground being a Corner post of the Land laid out to John Mendenhall and Company, from thence by a Line of marked trees East two hundred and fifteen perches to another post sett in the ground, from thence South South East one hundred and ninety perches to another post sett in the ground, from thence South fourty degrees West two hundred twenty and seven perches to a marked black oak, from thence West one hundred forty and five perches to a post sett in the ground, being another Corner post belonging to and bounding the aforesaid land laid out to the said John Mendenhall and Company from thence by a Line of marked trees dividing the said Tract from this North three hundred fifty and one perches to the first mentioned corner post. Containing five hundred and fifteen acres and seventeen perches and a half. Surveyed the 25th day of the 10th month 1700, and Returned according to the above said survey, and bounds into ye Proprietary and Governour's Secretary's office the 4th day of the 2^d month 1701.
