


Tallamy



By Virtue of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the fifth day of November 1719 for the Laying Out 1000<sup>acres</sup> of Land to Samuel Powell in Right of John Cole. Surveyed to <sup>sd</sup> Samuel Powell 500<sup>acres</sup> part of 5<sup>d</sup> 1000<sup>acres</sup>. Situate in the County of Bucks. Beginning at a black oak a Corner of a tract of land laid out to an Indian Named Tallamie. thence by the sd tract East 230 perches to a post, thence by Vacant Land South 294 perches to a white oak, thence by Vacant Land West 374 P<sup>s</sup> to a post thence by Vacant land North 120 perches to a post, thence by land of William Allen East 144 perches to a w<sup>t</sup> oak, thence by William Allen North 174 perches to the place of Beginning. Containing 500<sup>acres</sup> with ye usual Allowance of six & Cent.

Surveyed July 20<sup>th</sup> 1735.
