



Pursuant to a Warrant from ye Prop^{rs} Commiss^{rs} dated the 25th day of the first M^o 1720. I Survey'd to Richard Parker Jun^r of Derby in Chester County A Certain Tract of Land. Situate Lying & being on a Branch of Brandewine Creek in the sd County of Chester.

Beginning at Gum Tree Standing in the Line of ye Land of James Gibbens. Thence North West by North by the Land of the sd James Gibbens 207 pches to a Post. thence West by North by a Line of Marked Trees 218 pches to ~~the~~ another Post, thence South by West by a Line of Marked Trees 146 pches to a Hickery Tree, thence East by South 364 pches to the place of Beginning. Containing 250 Acres with an allowance of Six p^{er} Cent. Lands laid out to the several Persons named above since the Survey of this Land.

Survey'd the 3^d day of ye 9th month 1720.
