



By Virtue of A Warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing Date The 27<sup>th</sup> Day of ye 11<sup>th</sup> M<sup>o</sup> 1719/20. Surveyed and laid out for Ingle Peters A Certain Tract of land. Scituate near Oley in the County of Philadelphia. Begining at a Black Oak Marked for a Corner Stand-  
ing - a line of Arnold Hufnealds land. Thence by the Same <sup>N. West</sup> fifty Nine perches to a Post of S<sup>d</sup> Hufnealds Land and the Same Course by Vact Land Eighty three perches to a hickery Tree marked for a Corner. Thence by Vact Land North East One hundred And Eighty perches to a Post. Thence by Vact Land South East one hundred forty and Two perches to a Post. Thence by Vact Land one hundred and Eighty perches to the place of begining. Containing one hundred and fifty Acres with allowance of Six & Cent. Surveyed June the 6<sup>th</sup> 1720
