

Pursuant to a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property bearing Date
the 7th of the 2d Month 1714. There was Survey'd unto Thomas Andrews on
the 13th of the 3d Month 1715 a Tract of Land at Peequea- in the County
of Chester. Containing two hundred and fifty acres being the Original Purchase of Enoch Flower Who Granted the same to War Player
and the said Player conveyed the same to the 3d Thomas Andrews
the said Tract. Beginning at a Black Oak in the Bounds of James
Logan's Land and Running by James Clansons Land North West by
North four hundred pches to a Post. Then North East One hunded
and two pches to Marked Black Oak. Then South East by South by
Joseph Jarvis's Land four hundred perches to a Post. Then South
West by the Said James Logan's Land One hundred and two perches
to the Beginning.
