

Isaac Heer's Land at Conestoga Begining at<sup>a</sup> Corner Marked Elme Tree  
by the side of the sd Creek being a Corner of Jacob Gritor and Jacob Hy-  
stater's Land, thence north by ye same Land 33 perches to a White oak, thence  
north west by ye same Land the land of Jacob Shank and John Moy 433  
perches to a Hickery Tree, thence = south south west by the Land of John  
Rubert 45 perches to a white oak, thence South East by the Land of Abraham  
Heer 190 perches to a Hickery, thence South West by ye same Land 20 perches  
to a Black Oak by ye sd Creek, thence up ye same Traversing the several ~~several~~  
courses thereof 500 perches to ye place of begining. Containing 200  
acres with the usual allowance of 6 P.C.
