



Surveyed to John Jones on the 15<sup>th</sup> day of April 1734 a Tract of Land Situate in the County of Philadelphia being part of Ten Thousand Acres of Land laid out to Sundry Swedes on the East Side of the River Schulkill. Beginning at a Corner <sup>Post</sup> of a tract of land belonging to Benjamin Boone. thence by ~~the~~ land of Marcus Hulings - North Twenty Degrees East four hundred and fifty four perches to a white oak. thence by Land of Edward Rees South Seventy Degrees East Seventy three perches <sup>& other land</sup> to a post. thence by land of Edward Farmer & Company, South Twenty Degrees west four hundred and fifty four perches to a post. thence by Land of sd Benjamin Boone North Seventy Degrees West Seventy three perches to the place of Beginning. Containing Two Hundred Acres besides an Allowance for Roads &c. part of 402 acres laid out to Mouns Jones <sup>viz</sup> the N.E. End thereof. Surveyed April 15<sup>th</sup> 1734.
