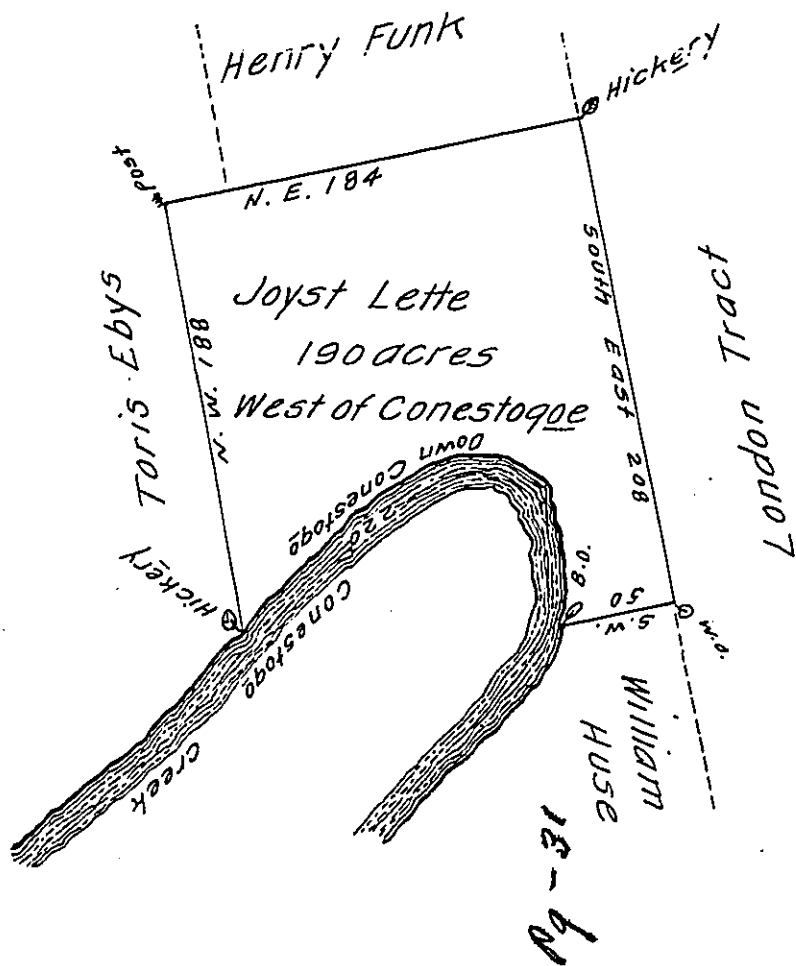


This Land of Joyst Lettes is  
 part of Marten Hendricks  
 and John Heer who obtained a  
 Warrant of 5000 Acres in sev'l Tracts  
 dated the 22<sup>d</sup> of Nov<sup>r</sup> 1717.  
 Surveyed November 10<sup>th</sup> 1720.



Begining at a Corner marked Hickery Tree standing on the West side  
 of ye 5<sup>d</sup> Conestogoe Creek. thence N.W. by the Land of Tores Eebys 188  
 perches to a post. thence N.E. by ye same Land and the Land of Henry  
Funk 184 perches to a Hickery Tree. thence S.E. by the Land of ye Lon-  
don Company 208 perches to a White oak. thence South West by the  
 Land of William Huse 50 perches to a Black oak by ye 5<sup>d</sup> Creek. thence  
 Down the same Traversing the several Courses thereof 220 perches  
 to the place of Begining. Containing 190 acres with ye usual allowance  
 of 6 p<sup>r</sup> C.

IN TESTIMONY that the above is a copy of the original remaining on file in  
 the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made  
 conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of  
 February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused  
 the Seal of said Department to be affixed at Harrisburg,  
 this twenty first day of April 1910.
