E. by John French's Land 160 p^s to a White Oak, thence South by the same Land 16 p^s to a Hickery by the sd Pequea Creek, then down ye same 52 p^s to ~~the place of~~ ~~beginning~~ a Black Oak, thence North 73^d East by Vacant Land 60 p^s to a Black Oak by ye sd Creek, then up the same 175 p^s to ye beginning. Containing one Hundred & forty acres & ye allowance of Six & Cent. Survey'd by order of James Steel - the - of - 1719. By Warr^t from ye Comm^{rs} dated ye 25th 5th M^o 1718.
