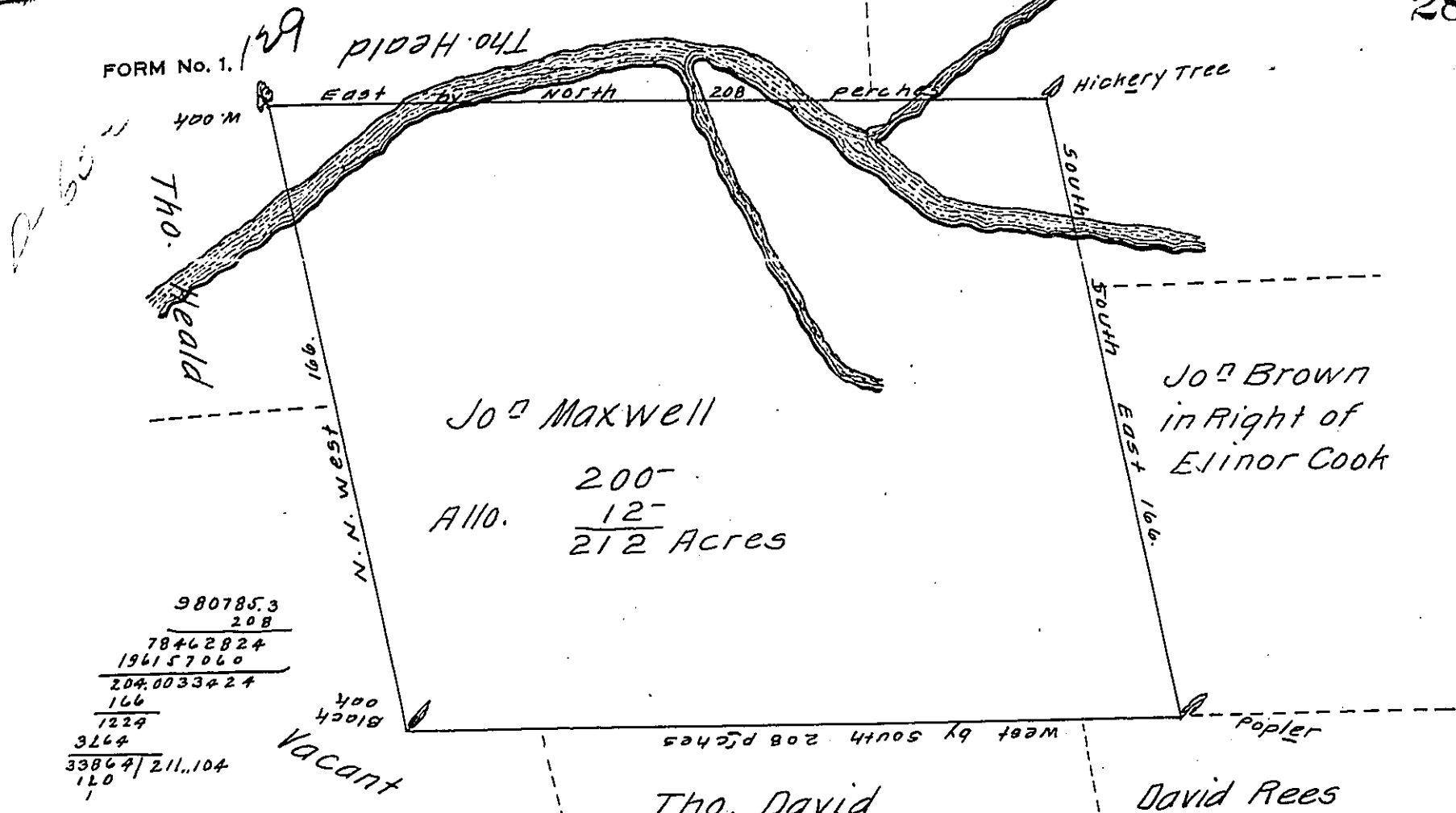

Begining at a Corner Marked Poplar Tree standing in y<sup>e</sup> line of David Rees. thence West by South by y<sup>e</sup> sd Rees's land the Land of Thomas David & Vacant land Two Hundred & Eight p<sup>ches</sup> to a Black Oak. Thence North North West by Vacant Land & the land of Thomas Heald one Hundred & Sixty six p<sup>ches</sup> to a White Oak. Thence East by North by y<sup>e</sup> sd Heald's land & Vacant Land two Hundred & Eight perches to a Hickery Tree. Thence South South East by Vacant Land & y<sup>e</sup> Land of Jo<sup>d</sup> Brown one Hundred & Sixty six perches to y<sup>e</sup> place of Begining. Containing two Hundred Acres with y<sup>e</sup> allowance of Six P. C.
