



By Warr.^t from the late Comm^{rs} of Property dated the 22^d of Feb. 1714-5 the above described Tract of Land was soon after laid out to Jonas Yocom by David Powell but his Return having a very apparent mistake in it, was rejected & the sd Jonas referred to N. Scull to examine the lines &c.

At the Request of Jonas Yocom Examined of the 13th Day of August 1739 the Lines of a Tract of Land being the same whereon he now dwells. Situate in Amity Townsp in the County of Philad^a. Beginning at an Ash Tree a Corner of a Tract of Land belonging to the Heirs of Thomas Fuller Dec'd thence by the same N 20 E 191 perches to a Black Oak, thence by Vac^t Land and Other Land of sd Jonas Yocom S 70 E 317 perches to a Post in a Line of George McCall's Manor, thence by the same S 40 W 258 perches to a Black Walnut Stump on the bank of sd River Schuylkill, thence up the same 236 perches to ye place of Beginning. Containing Three hundred and Fifty Acres with the usual allowance of Six & Cent.
