Richard Webb's Land in Uwchlan—
 in the County of Chester. Begining at a
 corner Marked White oak at a Corner of David
 Lloyd's Land. thence West South West 100 per
 ches to a post. thence South 315 perches to a post. thence South 37 Degrees
 Westerly 65 perches to a White oak. thence South East by South 140 perches
 to a Gum Tree. thence North 37 Deg. Easterly 177 perches to a post.
 thence N.E. by East 136 perches to a Chesnut Tree. thence N.E.
 31 perches to Post. thence N.W. by North by ye Land of the sd David
 Lloyd 344 perches to the place of Begining. Containing 500 Acres
 with the usual allowance of 6 p^r. C.

250 Acres of this Land was Survey'd the 31 of 8th 1713 by virtue of a
 Warrant from the Proprietors Comissioners Dated the 20 of ye 4th Mo
 1712 in Right of Thomas Hayward's Original purchase. the other 250
 was survey'd the first Day of May 1718 and is a New Purchase from
 ye Comissioners.

 the Department of Internal Affairs of Pennsylvania, made
 conformably to an Act of Assembly approved the 16th day of
 February, 1833, I have hereunto set my Hand and caused
