



Pursuant to a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property dated the thirtieth day of Decemb<sup>r</sup> 1730. Surveyd to John Naglee in right of John Millington of Shrewsbury in the County of Salop a Certain Tract of Land Situate in the County of Philad<sup>a</sup>. Begining at a Post being a Corner of Paul Henricks Land thence by the Same N. East 180 perches to a White Oak, thence by land of John Lukins S. E. 188 perches to a post. Thence S. W. 180 perches to a Post. Thence North West 188 perches to the place of begining. Containing Two hundred Acres with allowance of Six  $\frac{1}{2}$  Cent. Surveyd Feb<sup>r</sup> 10<sup>th</sup> 1730.
