



In pursuance of a Warrant from the Commissioners of Property Dated the tenth day of September in the Year 1717 for Surveying to David Powel of Philadelphia Surveyor three thousand acres of Land in this province. There was survey'd and set out unto Michael Ziegler. Purchaser under the said David Powel in December 1717 a Certain Tract or Parcel of Land in the County of Philadelphia. Beginning at a post at a Corner of Henry Panibaker's Land and Extending thence by a line of Bebbers Township North West One hundred and sixty pchs to a ^{Post} Then North East by the land of Jacob Colph One hundred perches to a Black Oak. Then South East One hundred and sixty perches to a Post. Then South West by the said Panibaker's land one hundred perches to the place of Beginning Containing one hundred acres.
