Whereas in Pursuance of a Warrant from the late  
 Commission<sup>rs</sup> of Property, <sup>dated ye 28<sup>th</sup> of June 1715</sup> there was surveyed on the 26<sup>th</sup> day of May 1718  
 unto William Sherrell a Tract of land situate on Pequea Creek, <sup>now</sup> in the County  
 of Lancaster, containing two hundred acres of Land and the usual Allowance  
 for Roads &c. The right to a certain part whereof hereafter described  
 is now vested in Woolrick Stopher. Beginning at a white Walnut tree by  
 Pequea Creek at a corner of Albertus Hendrickson's land & extending  
 thence by the same East by North two hundred & seventy perches to a  
 black oak, thence by vacant land South by East one hundred & forty per-  
 ches to a Chesnut oak & West by South twenty eight perches to a white oak  
 thence by Christian Prenaman's land North twenty five degrees West  
 eighty perches to a Post & West by South two hundred & twelve perch<sup>s</sup>.  
 to an Ash tree on the bank of the said Creek, thence up by the same on  
 several courses sixty seven perches to the place of beginning,  
 containing one hundred and fourteen acres, <sup>& ninety nine perches</sup> and the Allowance of  
 six acres & Cent for Roads &c. Returned into the Secretary's Office  
 the 30<sup>th</sup> day of May 1741.
