



By virtue of a warrant for the Commissrs. of property dated ye 23<sup>rd</sup>  $\frac{12}{m}$  1702. I have surveyed unto John Bud a tract of land begining at a Corner hickory standing in the line of ye London Company's Land then by ye sd line north 400 pr to a Corner Chesnut then by vacant Land west 200 pch. to a Corner Black oak then south 400 pch. to a Corner hickory standing by an Indian path leding to Elk river then Est 200 pr. to the place of begining. Containing 500 acres of Land Surveyd the 24<sup>th</sup>  $\frac{1}{m}$  170 $\frac{2}{3}$ .
