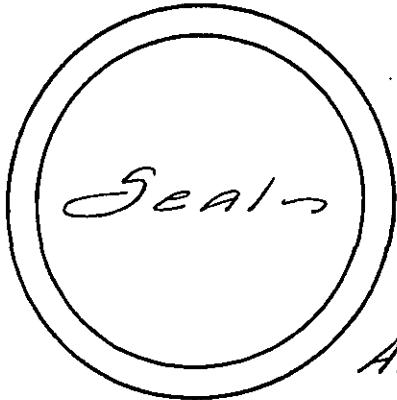


Pensylvania s. s.



By the Commissioners of Property.

At the Request of Ebenezer Large of the City of Philadelphia That we would Grant him to take up the Quantity of two hundred forty Six Acres of Land the Original purchase made of the late Proprietr. William Penn, Esqr. by Richard Mills of Bridgwater in the County of Summerset in Great Britain by Deeds of Lease and Release dated the 10th & 11th days of September Anno Dni 1681. the Right whereof being now vested [by Sundry Mesne Conveyances] in the said Ebenezer Large. These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be Survey'd in the Right aforesaid according to the Method of Townships Appointed the said Quantity of Two hundred forty Six Acres of Land that has not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is Seated by the Indians and make Returns thereof into the Secretarys Office in Order for a further Confirmation Given under our hands & the lesser Seal of the Province at Philada. the 25th. day of the first Moth. A.D. 1727.
