By the Commissioners of Property.

In pursuance of an Order from the Proprietor dated in the year 1701 for Granting unto John Longworthy Three hundred Acres of Land in this Province for the use of his three sons upon Rent to be held by him or them till they can purchase the Same. And upon an Agreement with us for two hundred Acres more to be added to the said three hundred These are to Authorize and Require thee to Survey or cause to be survey'd unto the said John Longworthy according to the Method of Townships appointed five hundred Acres of Land in this Province that has not been already Survey'd taken up or is Seated by the Indians three hundred thereof to be held under the yearly Quitrt. of One Penny Sterling for each Acre till such time as the sd John or his Heirs shall be able to purchase the Same at the rate of ten pounds p hundred & afterwards to continue upon ye common Quitrt of one English Shilling for each hundred And the other two hundred to be held from the Survey upon ye sd common Quitrt. he payin for the same within two years at farthest Twenty pounds for the said Two hundred with Interest from the first day of the third Month next ensuing otherwise this Grant to be wholly void And make Returns thereof into the Secretaries Office. Given under our hands and the Seal of the Province at Philadia. the 30th. day of Septembr. A. D. 1713.
