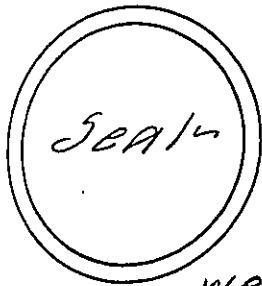


PENNSYLVANIA S. S.



By the Commissioners of Property.
 At the Request of Mordecai Lester, Henry
 Seaman & Adam Mott all of Long Island that
 we would Grant them to take up Two Hundred
 and fifty Acres of Land in Right of John Beckley who
 purchas'd the Same of ye Proprietor by Deeds of
 Lease & Release dated ye 10th & 11th. days of October
 1681 and afterwards Sold the Same ^{Land} to Thomas Place of
 Edington in ye County of Somerset by Deed bearing date
 ye 10th. day of September 1688 who by Deed of Gift Conveys
 ye Same to his Son Joseph Place of Long Island whose
 Son & Heir Thomas Place of Long Island aforesd by his
 Deed dated ye 2^d day of this Instant Grants the sd.
 Land unto the sd. Mordecai Lester Henry Seaman &
 Adam Mott. These are to Authorize & Require thee to
 Survey or cause to be Survey'd unto the Said Mordecai
 Lester Henry Seaman & Adam Mott in this Province
 according to the Method of Townships appointed the
 said quantity of Two Hundred ^{& fifty} Acres of Land that has
 not been already Survey'd nor appropriated nor is
 Seated by ye Indians and make a Return ^{thereof} into the Sec-
 retarys Office Given under our hands & Seal of ye
 Province at Philadelphia the 23^d. day of ye 9th
 Month Anno Dni. 1715.
