

Conroy 22^d. January, 1761.

Sir: With this I have returned the Draughts of Five Islands for the use of the Hon^{ble} the proprietaries an Order of the Thirteenth of October Last bounded by the River Susquehanna from the North or Blew Mountain down to the Mouth of Yellowbritches Creek.

No. 1. an Island Laying opposite Land of John Carsons & Rudy Hairs Land Unimproved.

No. 2. An Island Opposite Capt. Miffliins Land now in the possession of James Mitcheltree and John Chambers on the East side of the River, and west by one Mullegan who claim'd it to be his, and Inhabited by one James Coogly since our Disturbance arose about 4 years and claim'd about 4 Acres.

No. 3. An Island opposite Capt Thomas McKees Land on the East side of the River and west by Jno. Chamber's Unimproved.

No. 4. An Island opposite to John Harris's land on the Est side of the River and west by the Honble the proprietaries and Wm. Harris's Claim by John Harris and had it survey'd by one Thomas Carnachan a Deputy of Mr. Cookson's

No. 5 An Island Opposite to land of Christly Swarts and Jno. Potts on the East side of the River Improved by Wm. Chesneys about 5 Acres.

Sir your order to me was to Survey all the Islands &ct. from the Mouth of yellow-britches Creek to the Kittough-tinney falls which are the above and likewise a true Acct. of the same as I found
