

*Pennsylvania s. s. In Pursuance of a Warrt. dated the 29th. day of November 1768 requiring me to Survey and lay out for the use of the Honble the Proprietaries all the Islands in the River Susquehanna within the last Purchase made from the Indians I do hereby Certify that I have caused to be Surveyed on the 13th. day of December 1768 for the use of the Honble Proprietaries aforesaid a Certain Island in the River Susquehanna in the North East Branch of said River Situate about half a Mile below the Mouth of Fishing Creek in the County of Northumberland Containing fourteen Acres and Allowance of Six p Cent. Returned into the Secretary's Office the 29th. day of December. 1774.*
